

## **Installing iSilo Documents to your iPhone or iPod Touch**

To use iSilo documents on your iPhone or iPod touch, first you'll need to purchase a copy of iSilo from the iTunes App Store.

Once you have iSilo installed on your device, there are two ways to install iSilo documents to your iPhone or iPod touch. All of the details for both methods follow.

Method #1 uses iTunes. It's the fastest, easiest method.

Method #2 uploads the file via a browser so you can then download it to iSilo on your device.

## Method #1: Using iTunes

Connect your device using the sync cable to the desktop/laptop computer on which you have iTunes installed.

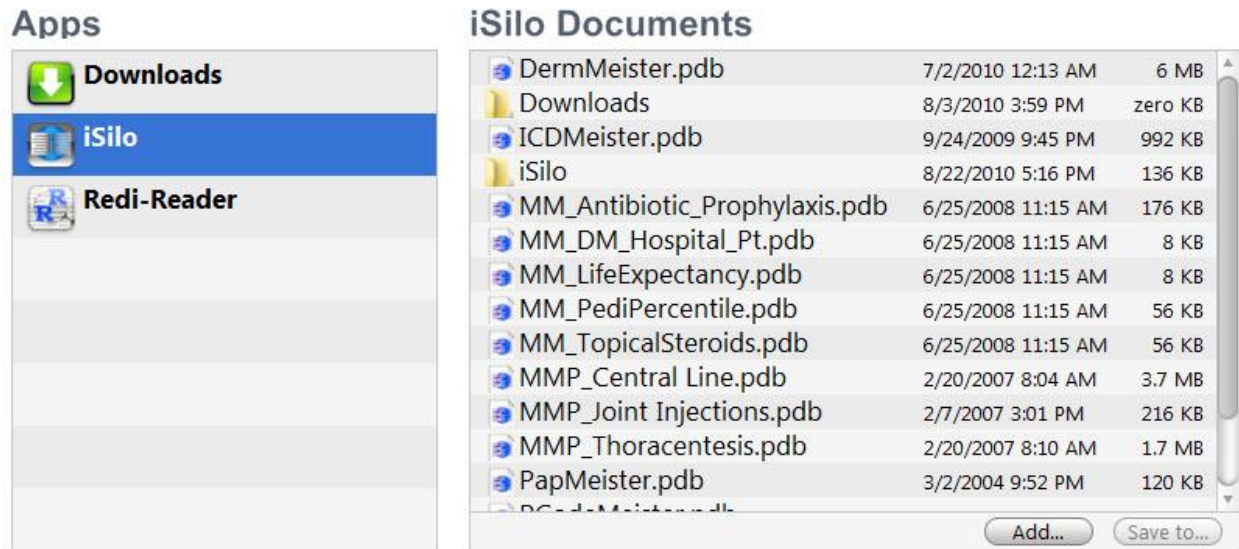


Click your device in the left hand column (red arrow above).

Next, click the Apps tab (green arrow above).

At the bottom of the screen you'll see the file sharing area (purple arrow above).

Select iSilo from the list of Apps that can use file sharing from the left column as seen below.

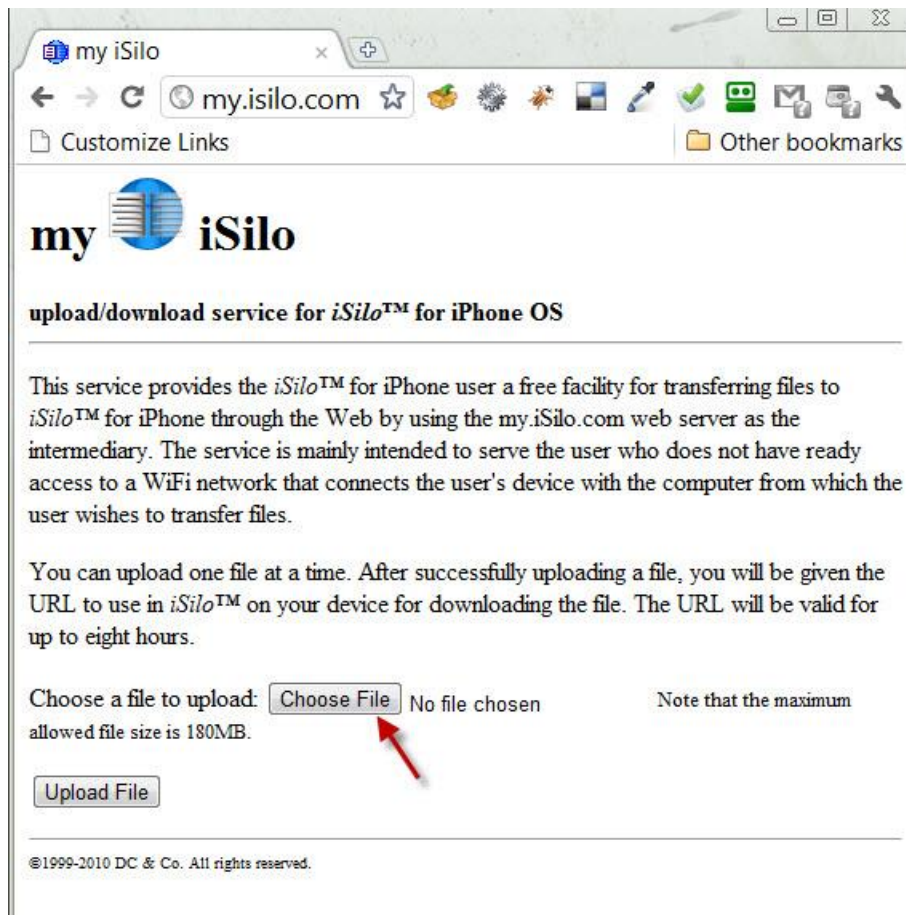


Click the Add... button at the bottom, browse for iSilo documents on your computer and add them to your list of iSilo documents. With your next sync, these files will be available within iSilo on your device.

## Method #2: Using <http://my.isilo.com>

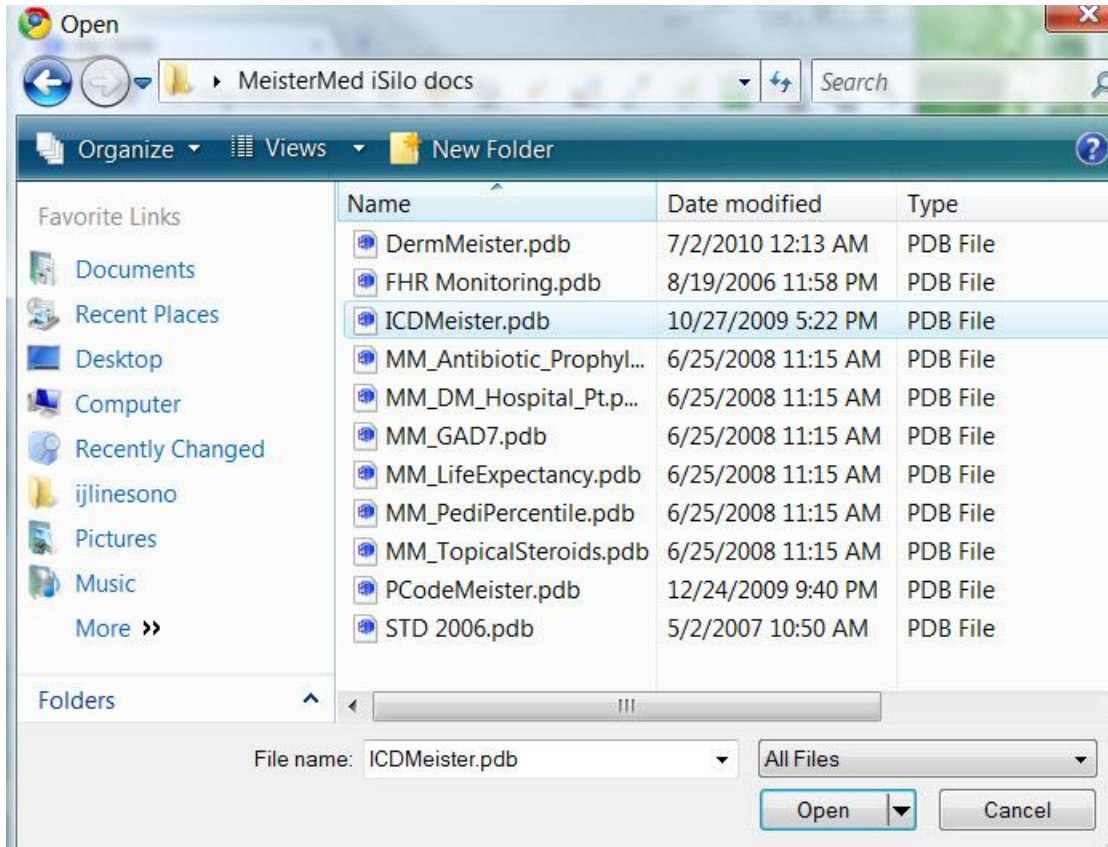
Save the iSilo document(s) you want to install to your laptop/desktop computer's desktop so they'll be easy to find.

In any Internet browser, go to <http://my.isilo.com>




Click the Choose File button (red arrow above)

Browse for the iSilo file (in .pdb format) that you'd like to install, select it and click Open. In this example, we're installing ICDMeister (MeisterMed's ICD-9 coding reference).



Now click the Upload File button.



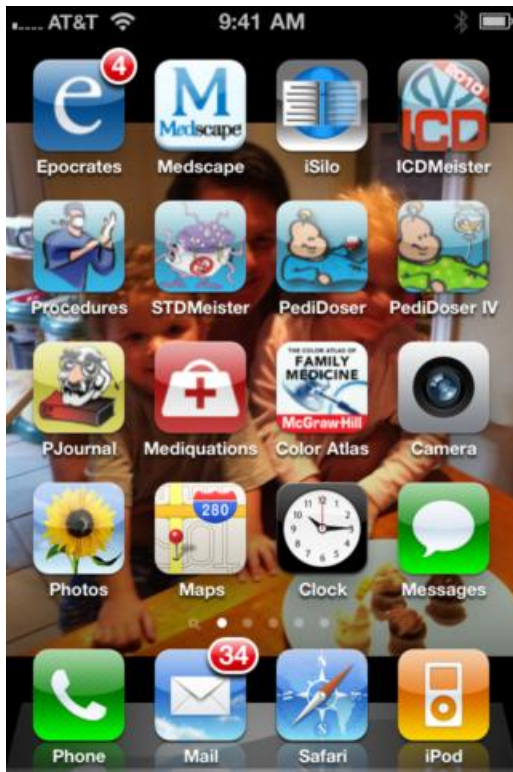
**The number on your link will be unique to the file you just uploaded.**

*Notes:*

- Make sure you copy the above URL, as otherwise you will not be able to download the file you just uploaded.
- The URL will be valid for up to eight hours. After that time the file may be erased to allow room for more uploads.
- To download, follow these steps:
  - On your iPhone/iPod touch/iPad, start iSilo™ and go to the document list view.
  - In the document list view, tap the button with the ellipsis (...) to get the List Menu.
  - In the List Menu, under the File section, tap **Download** to get the Download view.
  - In the Download view, enter the above URL into the address bar, then tap **Done** on the onscreen keyboard.
  - Tap the link that appears for downloading the file, then follow the prompts for saving the file to your device.

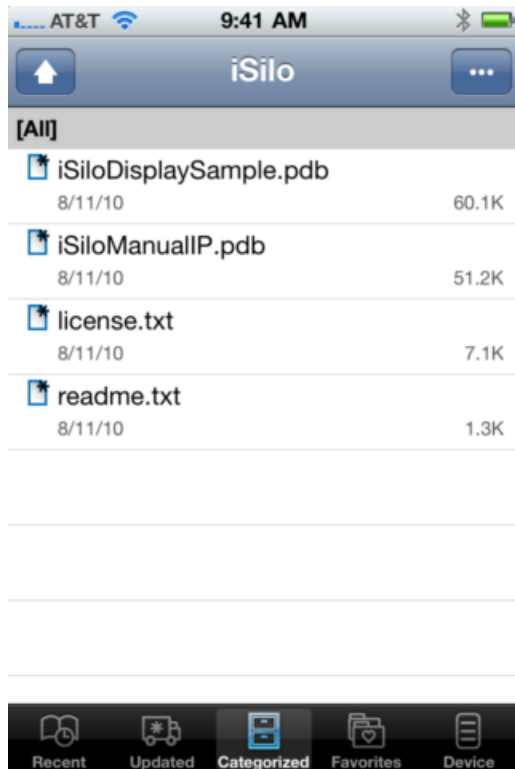
To upload another file, click [here](#).

Launch iSilo on your iPhone or iPod touch by clicking its icon.



Go to the document list view as seen below. If you have a document open, you'll need to return to the document list view by clicking the Document List icon on the bottom lower left.

Next, click the ellipsis (...) button in the upper right corner as seen below.



Click Download



After clicking download you'll see the screen below. Click on the URL field at the top and replace <http://www.iSilo.com/iPhone/iSilo> with the link you were shown on my.isilo.com.



In this example you'd enter: <http://my.isilo.com/75517001472> but your number will be unique to the file you just uploaded.

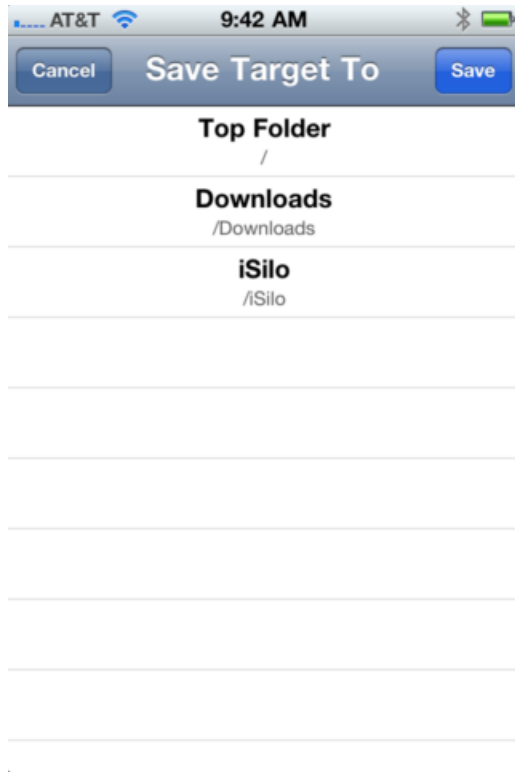
Once you've entered your link, click the Done button at the bottom.



Now you'll see a webpage with a link to download the iSilo document you just uploaded through my.iSilo.com. Click on the blue link. In this example the link is to ICDMeister.pdb. If you'd like to make the link bigger and easier to tap, touch the screen with two fingers and spread them to enlarge the view (this is called pinch-zoom)

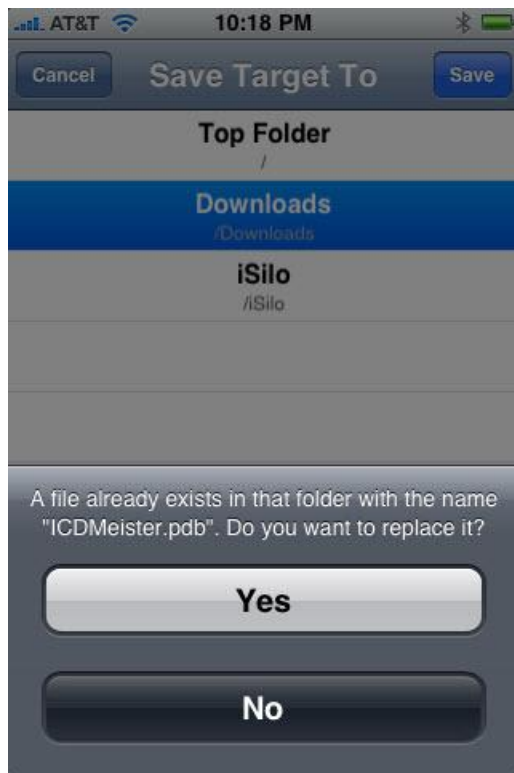


You'll see iSilo downloading your file and then you'll see the screen below where it asks you where you'd like to save the downloaded file. Top folder is a good choice or you can choose another option to keep your iSilo files organized.

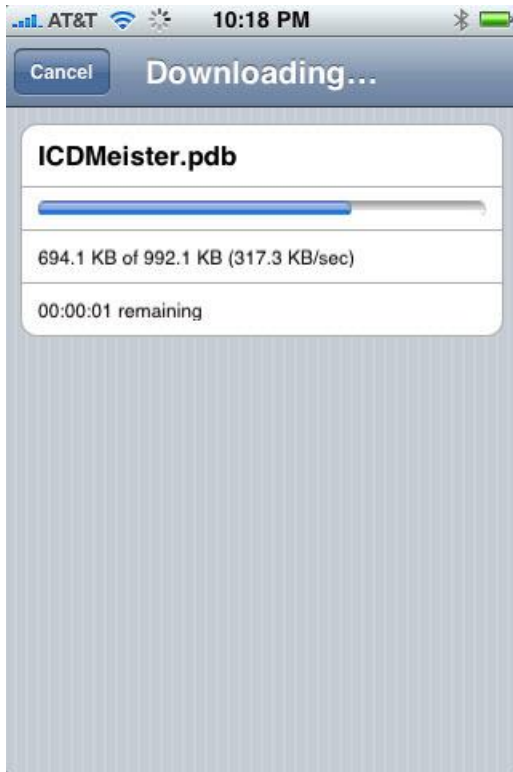


If you're installing an update of an iSilo file you already have (ie. an ICDMeister update), you'll see this warning.

Go ahead and say Yes to copy the new file in to replace the old file (otherwise you'll have two copies of the file floating around - one old and one current - and that could get confusing).



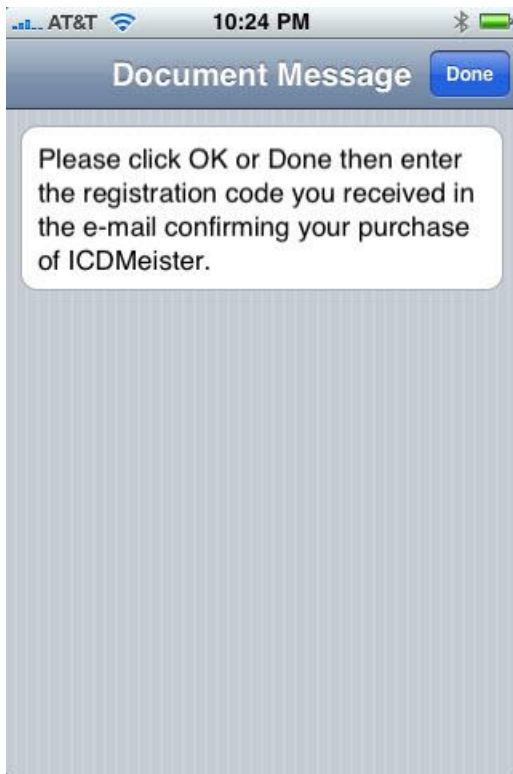
The iSilo file should download in a few seconds on a WiFi connection and less than a minute on the 3G network.



Once the download is complete, click the Yes button to open your iSilo document.



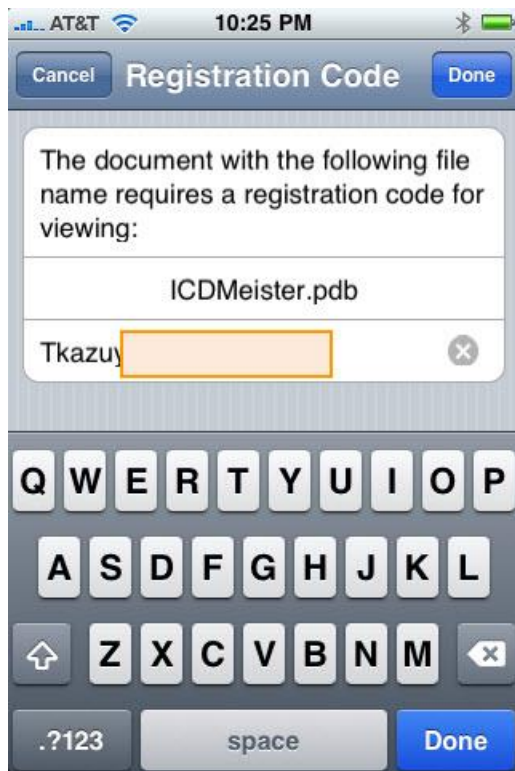
The first time you open an iSilo document requiring a registration code (ie. ICDMeister) you'll see this screen telling you a registration code is necessary.



Enter the registration code you received with your purchase to unlock the reference. You'll only need to do this once.

That orange box is stopping you from seeing the registration code used in this example (that's MY code).

Note that the registration code is not case sensitive (use capital or lowercase whichever is easier). You can also leave out the dashes if you want.



Job well done.

Now you're ready to use your iSilo reference.
